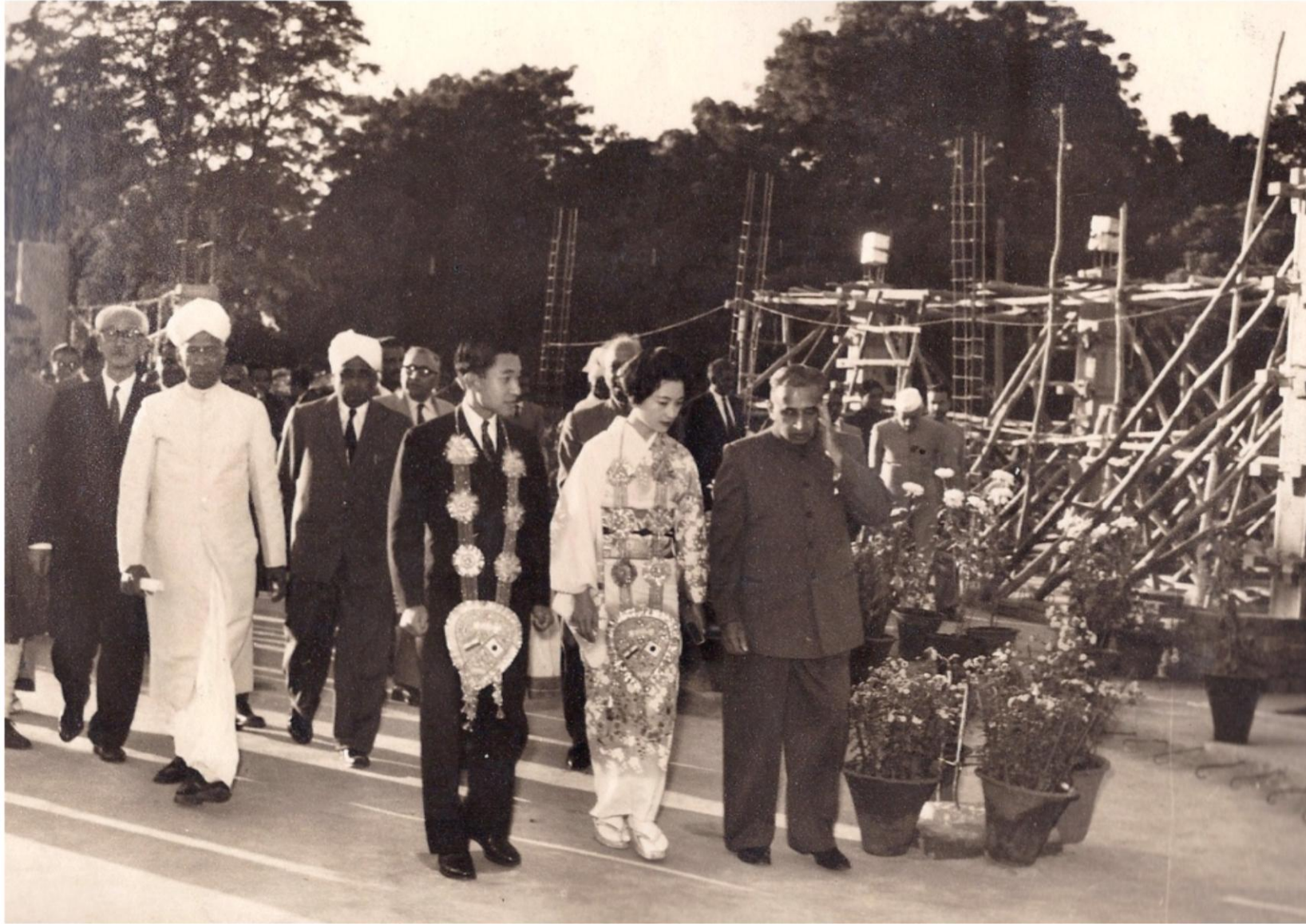


Foundation

- The idea of the India International Centre was initially proposed in 1958 by John D. Rockefeller III to Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan, then Vice-President of India.
- On **15 April 1960** the first sod of earth on site was turned by Smt. Kamaladevi Chattopadhyaya, a Life Trustee and the first Vice-President of the IIC. On **30 November** of the same year, the foundation stone was laid by Prince Akihito, the then Crown Prince of Japan.
- On **22 January 1962** the India International Centre was formally inaugurated by Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan.

Vision

- The India International Centre was founded with a vision of India as an ideal meeting point between the East and West.
- In the words of its Founder-President, Dr. C.D. Deshmukh, this institution was designed to **be a meeting of minds, a place where 'various currents of intellectual, political and economic thought could meet freely'**. Statesmen, diplomats, intellectuals, scientists, jurists, writers and activists convene here for discussions. Lectures and conferences initiate the exchange of new ideas and knowledge in the spirit of international cooperation.

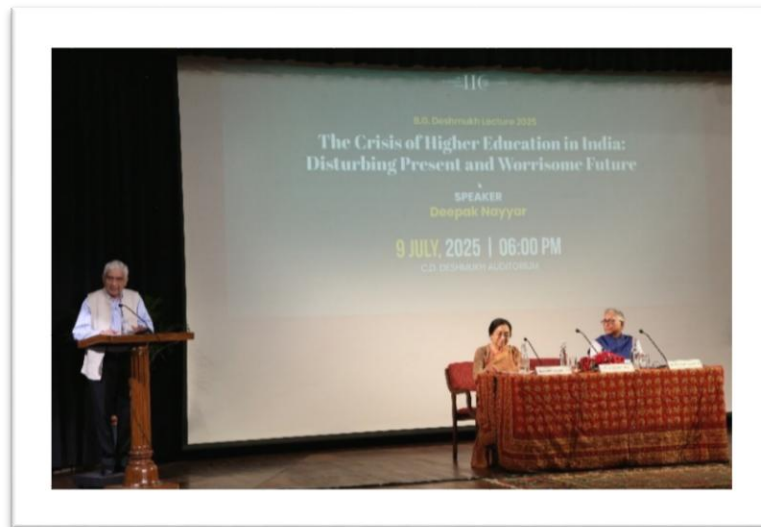

- Since then, the IIC Festival of the Arts has become an annual feature and held each year in the latter half of October. Every open space and venue in the Centre comes alive as the events unfold. For one week, the IIC is decorated with lamps and flowers and its gardens are lit up to highlight the festive atmosphere.

Exhibition

- Initiated in 1967, the IIC Film Club is today the oldest functioning film society in Delhi.
- Open to all members of the Centre.
- Every month the Film Club screens four to six films of merit and excellence, such as experimental works and art house cinema not normally available in the commercial circuit.
- It also presents festivals and retrospectives around the classic work of renowned directors as well as films by avant-garde directors in the international circuits.

The Library

- With comfortable reading spaces, computer terminals, Wi-Fi facility, and its helpful staff, the IIC Library is among the most favoured spaces in the Centre.
- The Library houses a rich compilation of:
 - About **56,353** Books
 - **156** National/International periodicals and newspapers
 - more than **7406** CD/DVDs in its audio-visual collection
- The Library has access to open source e-books and periodicals, especially the back files of the select Journal of the Royal Asiatic Society, Asiatic Researches, Journal of the Royal Asiatic Society of Bengal, e-books which are part of the India Collection and the Himalayan Club collection.
- **Library Hours:** Monday to Saturday from 9:00 am – 8:00 pm; Sunday & National Holidays from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm

DigiLib/WebOPAC

- Launched in December 2021, DigiLib portal of IIC showcases digital repository of legacy records of IIC Library collection, IIC publications and audio-visual records. The aim is to preserve the rare collections of IIC for maximum visibility and usage. The portal includes several communities and each of these communities comprise of unique collection with intuitive search and retrieval facilities.

International Research Division (IRD)

- IRD functions from the Annexe Building

- In 2022, the IRD launched 'SAMHiTA: South Asian Manuscript Histories and Textual Archive', a programme to create a database and digital repository of manuscripts of South Asian provenance in libraries outside India
- A project to document manuscripts located outside India and to digitize these rare collections in collaboration with Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) is in progress. It aims to digitize Indic-manuscripts located outside the country and make these valuable resources available online through the SAMHiTA website (<https://Samhita.iicdelhi.in>)

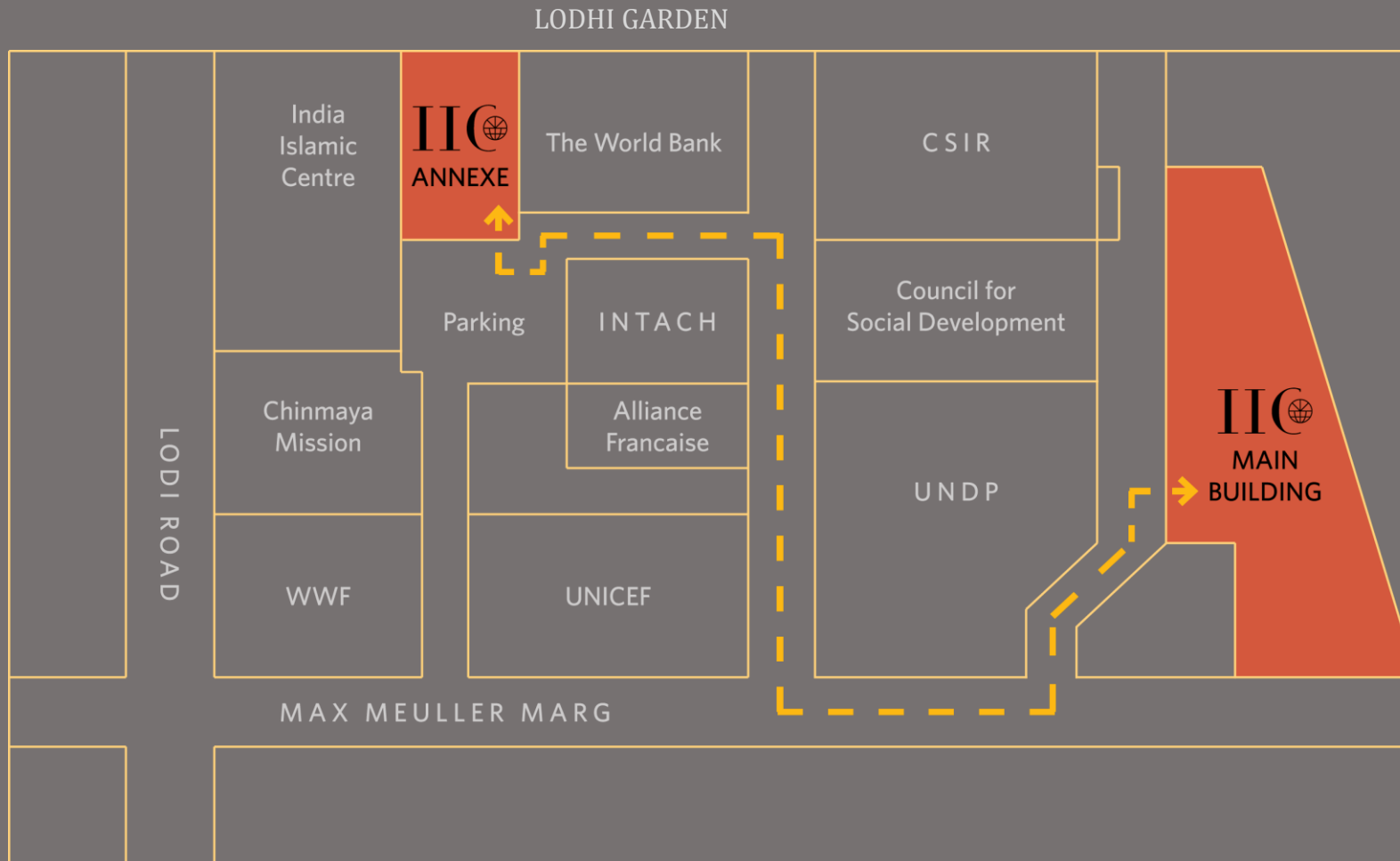

IIC MEMBERS' PROTOCOL

A few highlights from the Members' Protocol:

- 1. Whenever they visit the IIC, Members are expected to conform to the Centre's socio-cultural traditions and, particularly, to:**
 - I. Show courtesy to fellow Members and staff; to elders, ladies, and the differently-abled, especially to those in wheelchairs.
 - II. Ensure that their guests are well briefed about the Centre's regulations.

- 2. Members shall carry their Identity Cards (Smart Cards) and show them to the staff, whenever requested to do so.**

3. Members and their guests, who visit any venue of the Centre, should be appropriately dressed. The following are not permitted:

- Shorts
- Bathroom Slippers
- Barefeet
- Round Neck/Collarless T-Shirts

4. No tips to be offered to the staff at the dining facilities. All Staff are paid financial incentive from the Centre towards their services to the members on quarterly basis

5. Use of mobile phones is strictly prohibited in all venues of the Centre (Dining Halls; Lounges; Bar; Auditorium; Library; and all Programme venues).

6. Members are expected to not shout/speak loudly in the Bar, Lounges and Dining Halls (Main Centre and Annexe).

7. Participation of Members in the IIC Programmes is recorded. Members are expected to organise and patronise events/functions at the IIC venues.

8. Guests of Members are permitted. Entry to catering venues is @ guest fee of INR 100/- per guest. Maximum guests in dining hall is limited to 7.

9. Booking of tables in Dining Hall is advised especially during the weekends.

10. Entry of Children and Non-adults:

- i. Children of all ages are allowed in the Verandah (seating area) of the Main Centre Lounge;
- ii. Only children above the age of 8 years are allowed in the Dining Halls and Lounges;
- iii. Children of all ages are allowed in the Annexe Lounge only on Saturdays and Sundays;
- iv. No person under 18 years of age shall be allowed in the Bar;
- v. Parents/guardians shall ensure that their children are not left unattended anywhere in the Centre's premises.

Annual Subscription Fee

Rule 26 (f) & (g) states as follows:

- (f) The name of any member, individual or institutional, who is liable to pay subscription by 1st April of each year but whose subscription falls in arrears beyond 31st May shall be removed from the Roll of Members of the Centre unless the Committee shall otherwise decide, in which case the members whose subscriptions have fallen in arrears shall have to pay, in addition to the arrears due, a penalty to be fixed in each case by the Committee to be enabled to continue their membership of the Centre.

- (g) The name of a member removed from the Roll of Members of the Centre may be restored thereto only on payment of such sum as the Committee may determine in each case.

Annual Renewal of Membership

- The membership is to be renewed each year by making payment of the Annual Subscription Fee by 31st March.
- The name of any member, individual or institutional, who is liable to pay subscription by 1st April of each year but whose subscription falls in arrears beyond 31st May shall be removed from the Roll of Members of the Centre.
- If ASF is paid along with an **equal penalty amount** by **30 September**, the membership will be **reactivated**.
- If ASF is not paid by **30 September**, the member's name will be **removed from the roll of membership**.
- Members removed for non-payment may apply for restoration. Such cases are placed before the **Executive Committee (EC)** under **Rule 26(f)**. If restoration is approved, the penalty will be equal to the **Admission Fee plus ASF arrears**.

Smart Card and its Utilisation

- Smart Card has been implemented at the Centre which is also used as membership card.
- Each Member is provided with a Membership Smart Card along with Spouse Smart Card (if applicable) in case of Individual membership and Nominee Smart Card in case of Institutional Membership.
- The main purpose of this system is to provide the IIC Members with greater convenience and ease of use.
- The Smart Card also acts as an electronic wallet besides Membership identity card.
- IIC members would be able to charge / recharge their respective Smart Cards, to avail Catering outlets and other facilities.
- The Smart Card can be charged from the IIC Hostel Reception or Accounts Department (Minimum top up of Rs.500.00 (Five hundred only)).

Conversion of Membership

<u>OVERSEAS ASSOCIATE (OA) TO ASSOCIATE (A)</u>	As per Rules, in case of Overseas Associate Member returning to India, NO request for any change of category of membership is considered before the presently prescribed 10 years period since initial enrolment. Proof of relocation to the country is to be submitted.
<u>ASSOCIATE (A) TO MEMBER (M)</u>	As per the policy, an Associate Member is eligible for conversion to 'M ' Member on completion of 7 years of being an Associate Member.
<u>SPOUSE TRANSFER</u>	As per policy, on demise of the Primary Member the spouse is eligible for transfer of Membership. The membership is non-transferable to children.

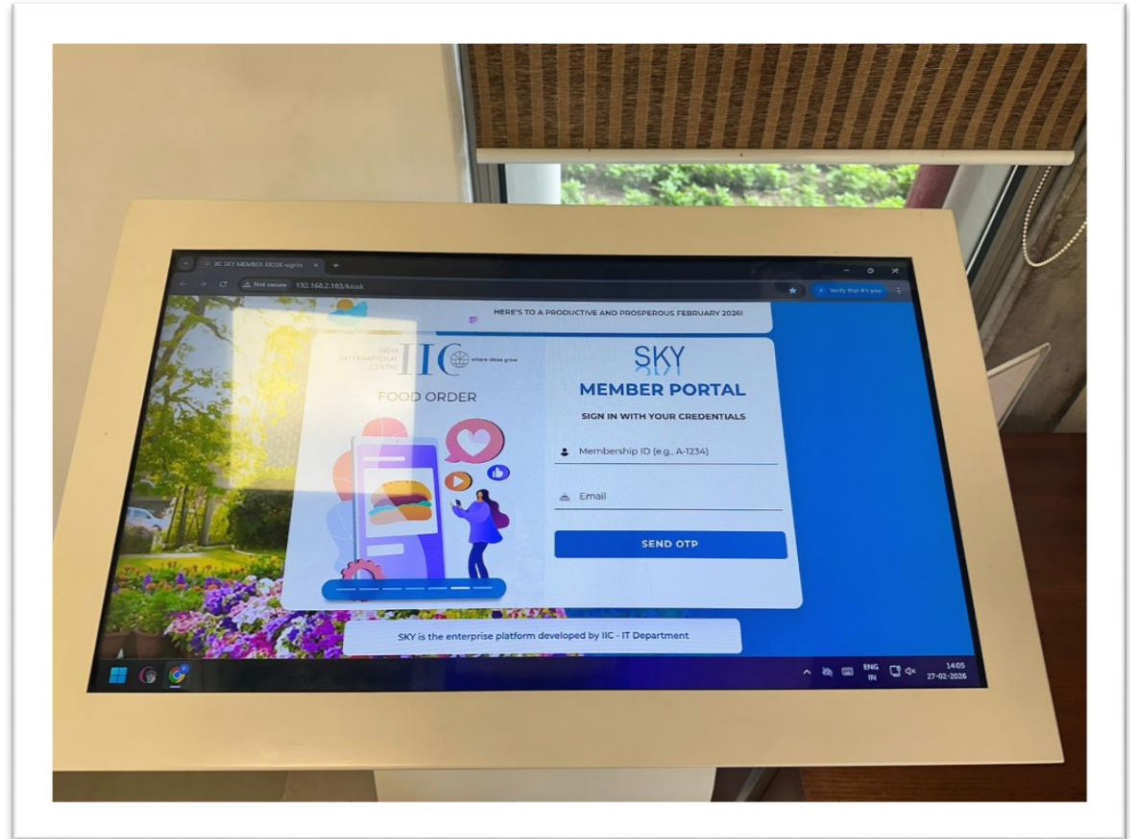
